In December 2001 our Founding Director, Dr Coral Kemp, established the STaR Inclusive Early Childhood Association Inc in collaboration with parents and professionals. Coral's unrelenting commitment to STaR and to advocacy for people with disability and their right to learn has been fundamental to STaR becoming the strong and progressive organisation it is today. We acknowledge her significant contribution to the lives of people living with disability as she continues to inspire and direct us all.

In our 20th year, we celebrate moving forward with confidence and clarity. STaR has evolved from being an incorporated association to a company limited by guarantee - Special Teaching and Research (STaR) Ltd. This enables STaR to expand its scope of delivery from state-based to national. A key focus over the next two years is to establish STaR Education as a quality national training division in Special Education and to pilot a post-school Lifelong Learning hub for adults with disabilities. Our work in the childcare centres and preschools with children, educators and families continues to operate well. Each year, the new children bring fresh change and challenge, which disallows 'service apathy'.

This year we welcomed Associate Professor Rebekah Grace, from Western Sydney University, to the STaR Board. Rebekah has been a member of the STaR Research Committee since 2014 and is passionate about understanding and addressing the support needs of people and families who are vulnerable.

We have weathered the COVID-19 storm well because of the years of support from The MonSTaR Foundation, Australian Stockbrokers Foundation, a businessman (who wishes to remain anonymous) and, more recently, Axi. This extraordinary financial support and continued belief in the work we do are deeply respected at STaR.


The years 2020 and 2021 will forever be memorable for the disability and education sectors. It has certainly given us a renewed perspective on the importance of science, research and community. Whilst our usual supports and operations were again significantly disrupted by COVID 19, we have continued to deliver quality learning support to the childcare centres, preschools and adult services we work with, albeit differently. The outcomes achieved under the strategic pillars of Educating Educators | Lifelong Special Education | Informing Communities are exceptional.

Our belief that lifelong learning for people with disabilities is a human right has remained steadfast. STaR has made significant progress in expanding its scope from the early years to providing services across the lifespan, which reflects our renewed Mission and Vision. This means that we have commenced a pilot program, working in adult post-school work and accommodation settings in collaboration with Fighting Chance, an innovative social enterprise for people with disability.

Research on post-school experiences and an online training course for support workers are well underway. Although we are in the early stages of expanding our scope, we are confident that the model we are developing will demonstrate the importance of continued learning for adults with disability. This has also led to implementing changes in our governance, operations and the way in which we deliver services.

This productive and progressive year was made possible by the community of people who support us: a committed and highly skilled Board and an extraordinary team of employees who have worked so hard to get through a challenging and unprecedented time so positively – together. In January 2022 we will mark our 20th year of delivering Special Education to over 30 childcare centres and preschools across four local government areas. We remain very committed to ensuring that our growth and success are measured by the level of our impact and its ripple effect on people and communities, not by the size of our organisation.




STaR Income for FY2020-2021

Outcomes Achieved 2020-21

1. EDUCATING EDUCATORS

Providing quality research-based training and mentoring

1.1 Course development

- Developed two new courses for Support Workers working with adults with disability.
- Developed two new workshops for preschool educators supported via the Disability and Inclusion Sector Capacity Building (SCB) Program, funded by NSW DoE.
- Converted two face-to-face workshops for early childhood educators into interactive selfpaced online courses.

1.2 Course delivery

- Invested in online learning platform (Learning Management System)
- Piloted online live webinar delivery of early childhood courses.
- Piloted delivery of self-paced online course for support workers.
- Enrolled 87 educators from STaR affiliated centres and preschools receiving SCB support in self-paced online courses (48 completed the courses before the end of June 2021).

1.3 Development and implementation of STaR generated research

- STaR research team formed a collaborative relationship with the research team from the Institute of Special Educators (InSpEd).
- Launched survey of parents regarding postschool experiences of young adults with disability (in data collection phase).

2. LIFELONG SPECIAL EDUCATION

Implementing best practice

2.1 STaR Lighthouse program

- Operated STaR program in 11 centres: Tregear, Doonside, Willmot, Rooty Hill, Bidwill, Ngallu Wal (Doonside), Top Ryde, Midson, Quakers Hill, Seven Hills, Kings Langley.
- Increased support to children and families in lower SES and Aboriginal families (Tregear, Doonside, Willmot, Rooty Hill and Bidwill).
- Offered four free quality professional training to all STaR affiliated educators (Transition to School, STaR Model, Shared Book Reading & Working with NDIS).
- Continued to offer weekly coaching and training face-to-face and via zoom throughout lockdown.

2.2 STaR Outreach

- Continued to offer quality outreach individualised program and educator support if families were NDIS self-managed (out of area or locally).
- Implemented Sector Capacity Building program funded by DoE to support 20 preschools with continued coaching, mentoring and training opportunities.

2.3 Lifelong Learning program

 Mentored Support Workers and developed training through involvement in a supported living home for young people with disability and a work program for people with disability.

2.4 Family support

- Offered ongoing family support and crisis management to any STaR family.
- Provided referrals to supporting specialist agencies such as domestic violence and mental health family services in the area.

3. INFORMING **COMMUNITIES**

Advocating for special education to a range of audiences

3.1 Increased understanding of the role of Special **Education**

- Maintained consistent focus on the importance of Special Education in STaR social media posts, online learning courses and face-to-face workshops.
